Overview

Live Cinema UK is looking to recruit for the newly created Coordinator role to support the organisation's rapid growth and development. The Coordinator will be a highly organised cultural professional with a passion for film and live events, sound knowledge of film exhibition in the UK, with solid events management and communications skills. The Coordinator will be responsible for co-producing Live Cinema UK's portfolio of artists and events in cinemas and festivals across the UK and around the world, managing our partner artists in the Live Cinema Talent Pool and developing the 2018 Live Cinema Conference. The successful candidate will be outgoing, full of ideas, and have good contacts within the UK film and cultural industries.

Live Cinema UK is based in Huddersfield and Sheffield, Yorkshire, but remote working with national travel will be considered for the right candidate, as will the potential to grow the role to a near full time position. We are keen for candidates to continue other work in the film and cultural industries alongside this role.

Key duties and responsibilities

Events management

- Managing practical arrangements for workshops and events for the Live Cinema Talent Pool
- Leading on Live Cinema UK live events at festivals and venues across the UK
- Co-programming and producing the Live Cinema Conference 2018
- Support the transfer of international projects to the UK and vice versa

Artist and cultural management

- Act as first point of contact for the Live Cinema Talent Pool, shortlisting and liaising with artists
- Identifying new partner venues, festivals and artists
- Support the delivery of ongoing projects with partners including Sheffield Doc/Fest, Leeds International Film Festival and BFI Film Audience Network

- Build relationships with UK film exhibitors and distributors
- Liaising with key partners and members of the Live Cinema Network Steering Group

Administration and communications

- Lead on organization external communications including website, enews, press and social media
- Developing and maintaining the Live Cinema Database
- Help develop effective in house communications/project management systems
- Manage project budgets
- Manage company diary including meetings and travel
- Oversee Live Cinema Network meeting dates and practical arrangements

Development

- Identifying commercial sponsor and funding opportunities
- Assisting with funding bid writing and report
- Pursuing new commercial contracts

- Experience of overseeing technical staff for live events, specifically audivisual
- Passion for film, festivals and live events
- Desire to contribute new ideas and initiatives to grow the organisation
- Uses initiative, calm under pressure and solves problems
- Financial management tracking project spend, invoicing and receipts
- Social media skills: Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and Youtube
- Willingness to work antisocial hours including evening and weekends, national and international travel
- Solid IT skills including Microsoft Office, Wordpress CMS and Google Drive
